Founded in 1872 in Italy

by St. John Bosco and St. Maria Domenica Mazzarello

At the persistent request of many people in Turin, and as a result of his own perceptions, Don Bosco resolved to take steps in setting up an Institute that would reach out to many poor and abandoned young girls.

He was inspired to do so, through his contact with various female institutes, his deep Marian devotion, the encouragement received from Pope Pius IX and the many inspirations he had

in this regard, through 'dreams' and significant happenings.

It so happened that in the township of Mornese, situated in the hills of Monferrato, a young woman by the name of Mary Domenica Mazzarello was accompanying a group of young women who together with her, were dedicated to helping young girls to learn a trade and while doing so, these girls were also guided in their Christian development.

> Today, the Daughters of Mary Help of Christians is the largest Congregation of women religious with nearly 11,000 Sisters serving in 98 countries.

Why Salesian?

By the intervention of Mother Mary and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, St. John Bosco worked with St. Mary Mazzarello to found the Salesian Sisters in 1872 in Italy.

FMA?

The Daughters of Mary Help of Christians wear a crucifix bearing the Latin words, Filiae Mariae Auxilium Christianorum



In English, this translates to Daughters of Mary Help of Christians. It is the official Institute name of the Salesian Sisters as conceived and founded by Don Bosco who wanted the Sisters to be a living monument of gratitude to Mary Help of Christians.

MOTTO: Da Mihi Animas – Caetera Tolle!

Give me souls – Take away the rest!" Don Bosco took this verse from Scripture (cf. Gen. 14:21) to be the motto for the Salesian mission in the Church. The laser focus of the Saint was the salvation of souls. No sacrifice is too small or too great. no discomfort, no inconvenience, or hardship can stand in the way of our joyful fervor for souls.
