Parish Resettlement Update Eritrean Refugee Coming Soon

In May 2019, our resettlement committee initiated a parish sponsorship with ORAT, Office of Refugees Archdiocese of Toronto, for a single man from Eritrea living in Sudan, his country of refuge. In recent weeks we have been in contact with our refugee and officials at Immigration Canada. We are in the final stages before travel. Although our refugee has not yet been issued his travel documents, we are hopeful that he may be coming to Toronto before the end of this year.

As we wait for the travel date, we focus our attention now to our parish commitment to the moral support of this refugee. Our parish commitment is for one year from the day of arrival. In the coming weeks, parishioners will be presented with a variety of ways in which help will be needed to resettle this young man.

To start, here is one way you or someone you know may be able to help.

HELP FIND TEMPORARY HOUSING

From the day of arrival until permanent housing is found, our refugee will require temporary housing. This would be for a period of a few weeks. Do you, or someone you know, have a place to offer?

Do you, or someone you know, have a place to rent for a minimum of one year? Funds for rent have been secured as part of the sponsorship.
