Understanding the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick:
The Healing Sacrament of the Living

#### **HOW IS THIS SACRAMENT CELEBRATED?**

Before the moment of anointing, the priest first lays hands in silence on the head of the person who is receiving the sacrament. The priest then anoints the forehead and hands of the sick person with blessed oil and offers a prayer of faith. Family members and other members of the Christian community are encouraged to be present at the time of the celebration of the sacrament to offer their loving support. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick may be celebrated in a person's parish church either as part of the Eucharist. It may also be celebrated in the home, a hospital or nursing home.

#### WHAT IS THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is especially intended to strengthen those who are suffering serious illness. It is offered to support, encourage and comfort all those who are seriously ill. Participation in the celebration of this sacrament offers those who are sick an opportunity to open themselves to the healing power of God's grace and to continue to grow in wholeness. In this sacrament, we meet Jesus who heals and consoles us by giving us the Holy Spirit. The Risen Lord comes to strengthen us in body, mind and spirit during our time of illness.

## WHO SHOULD CELEBRATE THE SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK?

Those who are elderly and whose frailty is becoming more pronounced. Those adults and children who are suffering from a major illness, are facing surgery, serious medical tests or have suffered a serious accident. Those who suffer from chronic illness such as arthritis or diabetes, or who suffer from a serious mental illness. There is a need for those who are gravely ill to have expressed a desire, or by their lives to have demonstrated, that celebrating this sacrament would be important to them. It is not enough for family members or hospital staff to desire it on the sick person's behalf. It is important to try to ensure that those who are sick and those around them understand the significance of the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick as a sacrament of healing and are prepared to celebrate it well.

## PROJECT HOPE: Newcomer Family Arriving March 17

Since the start of the new year, our parish received notice from the Office for Refugees, Archdiocese of Toronto, (ORAT), about the arrival date of a Pakistani family our parish is sponsoring. With sponsorship funds provided by Project Hope through the ORAT office, our parish commitment to this family is to assist them in the resettling process for 12 months after the day of arrival. The family is a mother and father, two sons and one daughter. They are scheduled to arrive in Toronto on Friday March 17.

To prepare for the family's arrival and the early stages of the resettlement process, your help is appreciated in the following ways.

#### **TEMPORARY HOUSING**

From the day of arrival on Friday March 17, until permanent housing is found, the family will require temporary housing. This could be a basement apartment suitable for five people.

#### **PERMANENT HOUSING**

Upon arrival, family members will have Permanent Residence status and will be in a position to sign a Lease Agreement and to pay monthly rent. Do you or someone you know have space in your home to rent? Preferably north Etobicoke: three bedroom upstairs of a house or three bedroom apartment.

#### **DONATE SERVICE**

Drivers with access to a car, available during the day, to assist with transportation to government agencies, resettlement agencies, grocery shopping.

#### **IN-KIND DONATIONS**

- 1 queen bed (frame and box spring)
- 3 twin beds (frame and box spring)
- mattresses: 1 queen, 3 twin / new or very gently used
- Kitchen table with 6 chairs
- living room furniture
- small appliances
- T\
- new or gently used household items
