St. Benedict Parish Advent Mission on the Infancy Narratives

For three evenings during the third week of Advent, Fr. Thomas Rosica, CSB will help us reflect on the great biblical stories of this holy season and take a deep dive into the Infancy stories of the Gospels of Matthew and Luke and the Word made flesh from John's Gospel. It is both



fantastic and crazy, wonderful and subversive, that the fate of the world would hang on the 'yes' of a teenage girl, but that is exactly what the Scriptures tell us. Not for naught is the plaque on the little altar in that grotto of the massive basilica of the Annunciation in Nazareth: "Verbum caro HIC factum est."

Basilian Fr. Rosica, a noted biblical scholar, lecturer, retreat director, author and friend of our parish and the Salesian Community, will share with us what is 'behind the scenes' of some of the most beautiful stories of the bible that have formed us from our childhood. He will take us inside our manger scenes and help us to appreciate the significance of each of the characters in our Christmas stories: Zechariah and Elizabeth, John the Baptist, Mary and Joseph, the angels and shepherds, the wise astrologers from the East, all those who welcomed the birth of this child in such poverty in Bethlehem, as well as those who opposed his coming among us as Lord and Savior.

The first witness to Jesus is, as Mother Teresa of Calcutta so wisely and truthfully pointed out, an unborn child. Mary and Jesus, Elizabeth, John and Zechariah — a family scene full of anxious, expectant chatter against the din of the doubters and the cheap gossip in a small town! That first Christmas reminds us of truths of which we can never hear enough. The Gospel stories of Jesus' birth invite us to become pilgrims and follow shepherds and kings, saints and sinners, and that long cortège of witnesses of all generations as they seek the light in the darkness and share their message of good news with a world steeped in darkness.

Come with your family and friends. Join Fr. Rosica and our parish community reflect on the 'greatest story ever told' and prepare for a blessed Christmas.
