

## November: A Month Traditionally Dedicated to Praying for the Dead

November is a month traditionally dedicated to intentionally praying for the dead. 
# Below is an excerpt from the Message of His Grace Most Reverend Francis Leo on Praying for the Souls of the Faithful Departed
